Garbage:

Village provides garbage services for our residents who reside in a single family, duplex or townhome residence at no cost. Residents are still required to contact the village to set up an account even though there is no charge. Please call 815-929-4800 to set up an account.

Household Garbage

- Household garbage is picked up weekly on your regular day.
- Each home in the village has received, at no extra cost, a 95-gallon garbage cart which is on wheels and has a lid to prevent garbage from blowing out.
- Additional carts are also available to rent from Homewood Disposal. See the online order form on their website: <http://mydisposal.com>.
- Garbage may also be placed in garbage bags or your own 35-gallon cans (up to 3 per week) as long as each weighs no more than 50 pounds each.

Yard Waste

- Yard waste season is April 1st – November 30th each year.
- The same company that picks up household garbage collects the yard waste.
- Grass clippings, leaves, branches, etc. are considered yard waste (no dirt or rock).
- Based on an Illinois State Law, yard waste must NOT be mixed with your garbage.

- All yard waste must be placed in brown paper yard waste bags. Each bag must have a yard waste sticker attached to it for pickup. Bags and stickers can be found at Whitmore Ace Hardware and CVS Drugs.
- Large (95 gallon) yard waste carts on wheels are also available to rent. See Homewood Disposal's online order form.
- Branches should be cut into 3 – 4 foot lengths and be no wider than 6 inches in diameter. Branches can be placed in the yard waste bag or put in reasonable sized bundles tied with twine or string. Each bundle placed outside the yard waste bag must have a yard waste sticker attached in order to be picked up.

For larger branches, the village does provide a chipper truck route. Check village website for details.

Recycling

- Recyclables are picked up every other week on your regular pickup day. Stickers with schedule are available at the village hall, local banks and library.
- Each home in the Village has been provided with a 65-gallon recycle cart for recyclables. This cart should be used for recyclables only; no garbage or yard waste.

Electrical Supplier:

The Village participates in a Municipal Electrical Aggregation Program. Residents are allowed to choose who supplies their electricity. The Village has a contract with MC Squared for the supply of electricity. Their contract began in October 2019 and is good until October 2021. Residents who move within the village or new residents are **not** automatically enrolled; you must contact them to sign-up. The phone numbers are listed under important phone numbers.

Water/Sewer Service:

Residents must set up an account with Aqua Illinois for their water/sewer service. (Sewer usage is based on your water consumption.) The Village will accept water/sewer payments in the Village drop box located at Village Hall. An Aqua Illinois employee picks up water/sewer payments daily.

Other Services offered by the Village of Manteno:

- E-Waste: The Village provides e-waste pick up for village residents only. If you have e-waste call the Village Hall for detailed information on the pick-up schedule.
- Battery Recycling: Used rechargeable batteries may be dropped off at village hall.
- Fluorescent Bulb Disposal: Used fluorescent bulbs may be dropped off at the Public Works facility at 700 South Oak Street and deposited in a special container.

- Chipper Truck Route: During April through October, residents may place large branches and bushes (no root balls) at curbside and a chipper truck will pick up and mulch the branches. The Village is divided into two routes:
 - 1) North Route (north of Division Street and west of railroad tracks) picked up on the 1st & 3rd Monday's of each month
 - 2) South Route (south of Division Street and east of railroad tracks) picked up on the 2nd & 4th Monday's of each month.
- Use of Park Facilities: Residents may use the pavilions and gazebos located in our parks on a first come first serve basis. Visit the village website for locations and details.

The Village Code for Manteno has been designed to serve and protect our residents. The following condensed ordinances represent those most often questioned or are of general interest.

- **Garage Sales are permitted.** No license is required, but signage is not allowed in the public parkway (space between sidewalk & street) or on light poles.
- **Number of Animals allowed:** No person shall keep a combined total of more than four (4) adult dogs, cats or other domestic animals or pets over six (6) months of age.
- **Grass/Weed Height:** It shall be unlawful for an owner/occupant of real property to permit any weed, grass or plant, other than trees, bushes, flowers, or other ornamental plants, to grow to a height exceeding eight inches (8") anywhere in the village.
- **Solicitors/Peddlers:** Solicitors and Peddlers are required to obtain a permit. Issuance of a permit does not convey an endorsement of a product or service by the Village and residents may, at their discretion, ask the solicitor/peddler to leave their premises.
- **Building Permits:** A building permit is generally required for all home improvements projects including, but not limited to: concrete, windows, sheds, swimming pools, electrical updates, installation of water heaters and furnaces. Contact the Building Department for details at 815-929-4803.
