Items for Discussion:

- **Significant Case Updates** – Chief Swinford presented the monthly stats for December 2021. (See attached.) He also supplied a report from the Stolen Auto Task Force; a 2021 report of naloxone use for the department; a use of force report for 2021; an Investigations 2021 year in review report and a 2021 year in review for the vehicle fleet. The department is still pursuing participation in the Domestic Violence Task Force.
- **Camera Update** – The use of the cameras has been invaluable to the department. The camera at St. Joseph Catholic Church did not work out but will continue to see about having one positioned on South Main Street. More cameras on Route 50 especially on the far north and far south would be helpful. Mr. LaRocque suggested that electric be installed at the new entrance signs and then maybe cameras added on the signs. The village has between 140-150 registered security cameras for the Camera Rebate program.
- **Personnel Update** – All new officers are doing well. Officer Nelson and Brandt have completed their FTO and are patrolling on their own. Officer Dokter is on the last week of his FTO and then will have his shadow step and then will be on his own by the last week of January. Officer Sinadinos is scheduled to finish her FTO and be released to solo patrol by mid-February.
- **Solar Speed Signs** – The signs will be moved to South Cypress and to North Maple Streets.

A motion by Mayor Nugent and seconded by Trustee Martin to adjourn the meeting at 7:32 a.m. Voice vote – all ayes.
